**Longhouse Registration** is \$25 per tent for the entire weekend, or \$25 per night if you are bringing an RV. Please make that check payable to "Spirit of the Suwannee". Additionally, you'll need a separate check of \$5 per camper (\$5 for each Dad, \$5 for each Guide), made out to the First Coast YMCA. This goes to pay for the various patches, Y-Reps, and other items. JaxCracker cars will also be available....so bring the checkbook, and you'll be good.

**Sacred Fire & Respect for the Great Spirit:** Please bring firewood for the Sacred Fire (each tribe should bring at least 2 to 3 nice logs). During the Sacred Fire, as well as the Opening & Closing ceremony, everyone should remember to wear their vests and be respectful when someone has the Talking Stick. New members, please bring your Acorns. During the Firewalk all Big Braves and Guides are to observe silence and reflect on their time as father and son. Please, no flashlights, only torches. Please walk into and sit quietly in the Sacred Circle, respecting each other and the Great Spirit. As in previous Longhouses, Firewater should never be an issue. We are here to respect the Great Spirit, each other, our families, our tribes, and the community.

**Reminders:**

- ~ Dress in layers, it can be in the 80's during the day and down into the high 30's at night this time of year.
- ~ Bring your bikes – Suwannee has nice paved roads for biking.
- ~ Don't forget your Tiki Torches for the Sacred Fire Walk.
- ~ If you want electric power for your campsite, bring an RV plug converter.
- ~ Put your campfires out completely – cold to the touch – 18 inches deep.
- ~ Leave your campsite better than you found it. Reinforce respect for forest, field and stream with your Braves.
